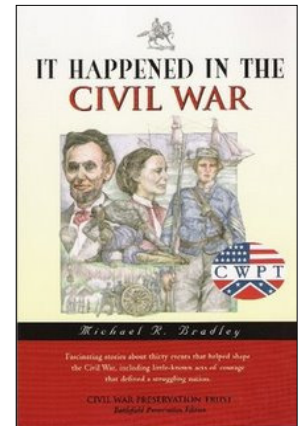
Special Observance Days:
